Here are some additional talking points for you:

- Civil legal aid programs are a vital safeguard for Massachusetts residents and communities, providing critical support in housing, employment, and domestic violence cases, among others, and helping people across the Commonwealth maintain safe, stable, and healthy lives.
- Lack of funding means that legal representation in civil cases is out of reach for most low-income people who need it. Sixty-four percent of eligible clients in Massachusetts who seek civil legal aid services are turned away due to lack of funding.
- In addition to catastrophic effects on the health, safety, and stability of low-income individuals and families, lack of access to legal representation in civil cases costs the state money, hinders our court system and denies the basic right of access to justice.
- Civil legal aid is a smart investment. Every dollar invested in legal aid saves the state money on costs for other services, including emergency shelter, health care, and law enforcement.
