OVERVIEW

The Boston Bar Association's Public Interest Leadership Program is a year-long program designed to provide intensive leadership and professional development training to rising stars in the Boston legal community. The selected class, consisting of talented and highly motivated lawyers from law firms, in-house legal departments, government agencies, and non-profits, will learn from and connect with leaders in Boston's public and private sectors to gain the critical skills and tools needed to grow as an effective leader and voice in the community.







ELIGIBILITY & COMMITMENT

Program applicants should be Boston Bar Association members within their first ten years in practice (although preference will be given to applicants with at least five years experience). The expected time commitment is 4-6 hours per month, or 70 hours per year.

Those who apply and are selected for the program will benefit from monthly training sessions incorporating education, discussions, debriefing sessions and participation in monthly BBA steering committees. In addition to these modules, participants will be invited to attend several programs, events and meetings connecting them with legislators, judges, non-profit executives, and corporate leaders throughout Boston.



After completing the program, graduates will enter a growing network of more than 250 accomplished alumni who embody the drive, passion, and diversity of our community. Program alumni have gone on to serve as elected officials, chair boards of local nonprofits, take on managing partner roles within their law firms, serve on the BBA and Boston Bar Foundation boards, and play key roles in Boston business and community initiatives.
