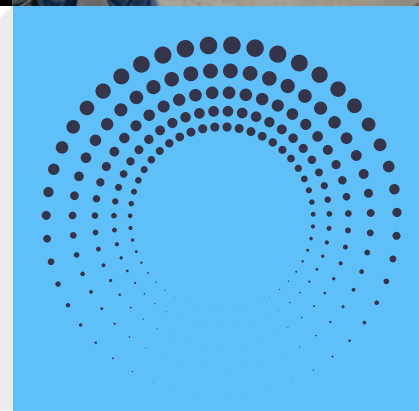

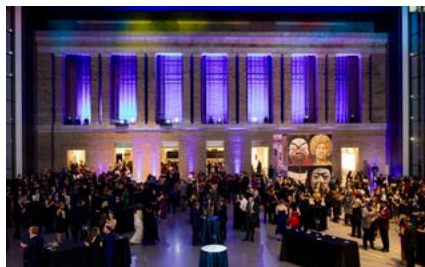


# The John & Abigail Adams Benefit:

# SIGNATURE CONFERENCES

BBA conferences bring together leaders across law, business, and government to explore the issues shaping our profession. The **Privacy, Cybersecurity & Digital Law Conference** opened the year with cutting-edge discussions on data privacy and AI governance. The **Higher Education Legal Conference** tackled challenges from student accommodations to athletics reform, while the **IP Year in Review Conference** covered developments in trade secrets, copyright, and NIL.

The **Employment Law Conference** examined evolving non-compete rules, misclassification, and DEI initiatives, followed by the **White-Collar Crime Conference**, where defense counsel, prosecutors, and judges weighed in on securities, healthcare fraud, and national security. The **Bankruptcy Bench Bar Conference** delivered timely updates, and the **Energy Conference** featured Massachusetts Climate Chief Melissa Hoffer in a fireside chat on renewable energy and affordability. Closing the year, the **Health Law Conference** spotlighted private equity, AI governance, and enforcement trends in health care.

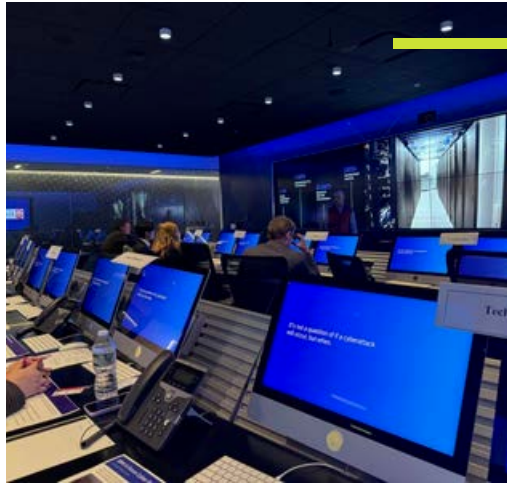

This year, the BBA welcomed nearly 200 students from our six partner law schools – Boston College, Boston University, New England Law | Boston, Northeastern, Suffolk, and our newest partner, UMass – at our annual kickoff event, giving them a first look at Boston’s vibrant legal community.

As members of the Law Student Network, **more than 5,000 Boston area law students** gain access to resources and programs designed to help them thrive both in law school and beyond.



The BBA launched its first Public Interest & Legal Services Career Fair this year, connecting more than **100 law students with 21 government agencies, nonprofits, and legal services organizations.** Students had the chance to meet with potential employers and hear directly from professionals committed to advancing justice.



For students exploring firm practice, the third annual BBA Career Fair brought together more than **200 law students and representatives from 18 leading Boston firms.** These face-to-face conversations gave students valuable insights into career options and helped firms tap into the diverse and talented student body representing the future of the profession.

# PUBLIC INTEREST LEADERSHIP PROGRAM



For emerging lawyers pursuing leadership and public service, the Public Interest Leadership Program (PILP) continues to set the standard for professional growth.

The Class of 2025 engaged in a year of intensive training, exploring topics ranging from government service and judicial pathways to responding to federal actions affecting the rule of law. 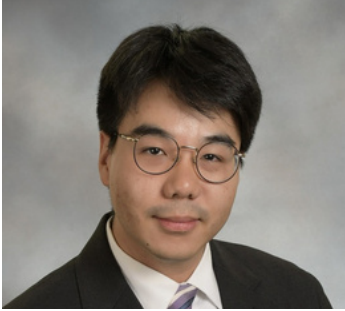
### SECTION PROGRAMMING

# ADVOCATING TOGETHER

*Championing Justice Through  
Policy, Advocacy, and  
the Courts*

The Boston Bar Association actively advocates for a legal system that is fair, accessible, and independent. Through legislative engagement, court filings, and collaborative initiatives, the BBA works to protect the rights of clients, support the legal profession, and uphold the rule of law.



## WALK TO THE HILL FOR CIVIL LEGAL AID

Each year, the BBA mobilizes attorneys, law students, and advocates for the Walk to the Hill for Civil Legal Aid, the largest lobbying effort for civil legal services in Massachusetts, organized by the Equal Justice Coalition (a partnership of the BBA, the Massachusetts Bar Association, and the Massachusetts Legal Assistance Corporation).

On January 23, 2025, participants gathered at the State House to urge legislators to protect and expand funding for critical legal aid programs. These sustained advocacy efforts have led to broad and deep legislative support for this funding.

# POLICY ADVOCACY & LEGISLATIVE ENGAGEMENT

The BBA engages the courts, legislature, and regulatory bodies to advance fairness and equity in the legal system. This year, the BBA advocated for:



## **FY26 State Budget Priorities**

Urged Governor Healey to support civil legal aid, the Trial Court, expanded language access, and permanent funding for the Access to Counsel Program in housing cases.

## **Civil Forfeiture Reform**

Testified in support of reforms requiring higher burdens of proof for forfeiture, greater transparency, and expanded right to counsel for low-income property owners.

## **Language Access and Inclusion**

Advocated for legislation mandating broader translation services in executive agencies to ensure equitable access for individuals with limited English proficiency.

## **Bar Advocate Compensation**

Called on the Legislature and Governor to raise statutory rates for indigent defense counsel to ensure sustainable, constitutionally required representation.

## **Probate & Family Court Rule Changes**

Submitted comments on amendments to Rules 1–6 of the Massachusetts Rules of Domestic-Relations Procedure to improve clarity, modernize service requirements, and expand communication options such as email and social media.



## AMICUS ADVOCACY

The BBA continues to advance fairness and due process through strategic filings in the Massachusetts Supreme Judicial Court:

### ***Commonwealth v. Santana***

Advocating for hearings to review inadequate legal advice to noncitizen defendants rather than deciding solely on paperwork.

### ***Commonwealth v. Gravito***

Supporting a broad interpretation of defendants' statutory access to their sealed court records to ensure the integrity of appeals and fair treatment under the law.



# DEFENDING THE RULE OF LAW AND THE INDEPENDENCE OF THE BAR

In 2025, the BBA took a leadership role in a nationwide coalition defending the independence of the legal profession, joining multiple amicus briefs in support of firms challenging executive orders that sought to penalize lawyers for their clients, including Perkins Coie, WilmerHale, Jenner & Block, and Susman Godfrey.

Coordinated with the New York City Bar Association, Harvard Law professor Jeannie Suk Gersen, and the Protect Democracy Project—and joined by 24 bar associations nationwide—the briefs warned that such orders would “turn the Bar into an instrument of the executive branch” and threaten constitutional democracy.

The BBA also spoke out on high-profile cases, including *Kilmar Abrego Garcia*, emphasizing the constitutional importance of judicial authority, due process, and the independence of the courts.

# BOSTON BAR FOUNDATION GRANTS: Advancing Access to Justice

The BBA and the BBF continue to strengthen the legal community's commitment to public service, pro bono work, and access to justice. Through grants, volunteer initiatives, and professional development opportunities, the BBA and BBF provide avenues for members to serve together and support the region's most vulnerable populations.

In 2025, the BBF voted to award more than **\$2 million in grants to 54 organizations** across Greater Boston, supporting programs that serve domestic violence survivors, immigrants, incarcerated individuals, low-income workers, veterans, children, and families in crisis. These grants, funded through accrued Interest on Lawyers' Trust Accounts (IOLTA), are a tangible expression of the Boston legal community's values.

A special second grant period this year focused on **Know Your Rights** programs, distributing nearly **\$250,000 to 25 organizations**. These grants enabled organizations to develop educational materials, trainings, and translation services so that all residents, regardless of immigration status or language spoken, can understand and assert their legal rights.

## ICE Detention Training Series

In 2025, the BBA partnered with the PAIR Project to host a comprehensive ICE Detention Training Series for attorneys of all experience levels. This multi-session program provides participants with the skills and knowledge to assist noncitizens in removal proceedings, covering topics from fear-based relief to bond and parole procedures. More than 300 attorneys attended sessions, and became eligible to volunteer on removal defense cases with PAIR, directly supporting members of our immigrant community.



## Pro Bono Month

October has long been recognized as Pro Bono Month, a statewide initiative celebrating attorneys' contributions to the community while encouraging greater participation in pro bono service to narrow the justice gap. The BBA supported this tradition through awareness campaigns, programming, and partnerships with local legal services organizations.

Programs offered during Pro Bono Month in 2025 included trainings on environmental justice, eviction defense, immigration support, family law, children's rights, immigrant rights, medical parole, and more.

## Engagement through Education & Connection

The BBA and BBF foster service and community impact by connecting members, sharing expertise, and creating opportunities to give back.

**Legal services gatherings** go beyond grant funding, bringing BBF grantees and BBA members together to exchange strategies and resources. This year's programs focused on addressing the rights of immigrant students and students with disabilities, providing critical support at a time of heightened challenges in the community.



Through the **Charitable Board Service Program**, members were matched with nonprofits seeking board volunteers and received training on board responsibilities.

**The BBA also supports attorneys in transition** with complimentary membership and professional resources, extending those offers this year to federal government lawyers and others impacted by workforce changes under the current administration, helping them stay connected to the profession while continuing to serve the community.
